

Recordings of the teaching require a safe and secure learning environment

Learning environment

For many students, it can be rewarding to revisit the teaching, and this increases flexibility, among other things. At the same time, recordings of teaching must take place in a safe and secure environment, so that it does not hinder active participation in the teaching itself. Some teaching methods are better suited than others for recording, which is one of the many parameters that are included when a teacher decides on a possible recording of the teaching. The decision is also based on other pedagogical and didactic reasons and on the basis of SDU's underlying principle: "[Active teaching and learning](#)".

For some students, it becomes a hindrance to participate actively if the teaching is recorded. Teachers experience less interaction, less engagement and thus less opportunity to involve activating elements. As a student, it also challenges the desire to participate actively, and thus the learning environment, if you are unsure or uncomfortable with the subsequent sharing of the recording. For example, it may be suspected that fellow students or a lecturer share the recording, despite the fact that it is not legal without prior consent.

Likewise, lecturers' desire to record decreases when they become aware that previous recordings have been illegally shared among students. The desire is particularly challenged when lecturers are using teaching materials that they have a special right to use or where the content is of sensitive nature, such as imaging material and demonstration of preparations etc. Students' copyright compliance is therefore crucial a lecturer's motivation to record and share recordings with students.

Copyright

The lecturer holds the copyright to the material he or she has created for the purposes of the teaching¹.

If the lecturer shares a recording of the teaching with the participants in the course room in itslearning, it is illegal for participants to share it with others or otherwise redistribute it unless the lecturer has given prior permission to do so (consent).

It is also illegal to screen record any online teaching material, including live streaming, and then share it with others or otherwise redistribute it, unless the lecturer has given prior permission to do so (consent).

In the event of a violation, the student may be reported to the Vice-Chancellor for the purpose of sanctions. Further information on sanctions for violations of the disciplinary measures at SDU can be found at [mitSDU \(MySDU\)](#).
