

💡 **Tip!** Good search words 🙌

- Check the university websites
- Courses for the autumn 2026 are probably not available yet – try to find courses from the autumn 2025 instead
- Pay attention to academic level, semesters, and the language of instruction
- Overseas? Check "[Credits to ECTS](#)" table for conversion of credits to ECTS (if relevant)
- 💡 **Tip!** Better to be thorough than quick

Application - Step 4:

Fill in the application

- **mitsdu.dk/studyabroad** → Opportunities to go abroad → Exchange within Europe/Exchange overseas → *Apply here*
- Prioritise carefully - you can't change it once submitted
- Only places listed on the PDFs are available (💡 **Tip!** search by ID number)
- You can list up to 8 priorities in your application
- Want to go with a fellow student? Match your priorities + mention that you wish to go abroad together in the comments section

Allocation of exchange places

- Full-degree student at SDU
- Grade point average (simple GPA)
- Minimum requirements
 - You must have passed at least 30 ECTS at university level
 - You must have a grade point average of min. 2.0 (U/absence from an exam counts as -3)
- Other factors
 - Needed ECTS load (minimum 20 ECTS) in exchange semester
 - Previous exchanges



Erasmus+ additional support

Who?

Students with physical, mental, or health-related conditions with special needs for support

How?

- Apply for extra financial support. Contact the International Office (students who are already qualified by SPS at SDU are eligible for extra financial support)
- Benefit from local support services at the host university

Support

There are different types of extra funding available through the Erasmus+ programme, if:

- You suffer from a chronic condition (physical or psychological) or a functional impairment (EUR 250 per month, as well as possibility of coverage of specifically high expenditures in relation to your stay). [Learn more about the additional Erasmus+ support.](#) 
- You are the primary caregiver/breadwinner for one or more children/persons (EUR 250 per month).
- You plan to travel to/from (or both) your destination by relatively sustainable means, i.e., train, bus, carpooling or similar (higher travel grant).
