
SDU's Common Code of Conduct

Your behaviour makes a difference

It is everyone's responsibility to ensure a positive study environment. We expect you as a student at SDU to help create a safe and positive study environment for you and your fellow students both on and off campus. Contributing to a safe and pleasant study environment for all requires that we each take responsibility for our own behaviour. We want a way of interacting where we dare to talk openly about both similarities and differences - freedom of expression is part of the lifeblood of SDU.

Respect the choices of others	 Create space for everyone to choose freely Respect fellow students' choices and opt-outs Respect fellow students' desired social conventions Respect a no
Show consideration	 Speak considerately to others Avoid making negative and derogatory comments about others Pay attention to your fellow students
Be caring	 Meet your fellow students with good intentions Support your fellow students when they face adversity Show interest and ask your fellow students questions about themselves
Say no	 Speak up if others violate your boundaries Say it out loud if you feel the tone is becoming negative and derogatory
Use good judgement	 Pay attention to other people's signals. Your attention and compliments may be unwanted despite your good intentions Although consuming alcohol on campus is allowed, alcohol is no excuse for behaving badly Pay special attention when entering into new relationships
